Course Title:	Introduction To Canadian Business Law	Rev. Date:	March 31, 2012

Course Description:

This course is intended as an introduction to the nature and framework of Canadian law, its operation and subdivisions. Emphasis shall be placed upon the study of the law of contract and the law of tort. This course is to provide a basis for future study of Construction Contracts and Contract Administration.
